

## Thank You for a Great Year

#### Brethren of Sandoval Lodge #76,

It has been my distinct pleasure to serve as your Worshipful Master of this Lodge for the year 2022 and I thank you from the bottom of my heart for giving me the opportunity to serve you all.

Coming into my year in the East in 2022 there were things I wanted to accomplish. And the vision of which I had really seemed logistically possible, but boy was I under prepared for how the internal workings of the lodge were set up. It became immediately apparent to me that for us to move forward in the future there were a few housekeeping items which needed to be addressed. Amidst the many discussions with various officers and with sage and generous advice provided by the alumni of Past Worshipful Masters. I knew what I needed to do.

After extensive reviews of any Lodge records and compilation of information, it was apparent that how things were set up was not a strong and productive system. This is not to say anybody was doing anything intentionally wrong mind you, but more to say over time shortcuts caught up with us, and perhaps unperceived. began to deteriorate the integrity of the foundation of which our Lodge should stand on.

It was amazing to me to hear from people of which I had no idea even thought about Sandoval Lodge, had opinions of the product we were producing fundamentally. Yes they would complement on the Great Brotherhood, strong activities and strength of influence we provided to the community at large. But when it came to opinions of efficiency of Lodge workings I am sad to say we were underwhelming.

I set out to try to address this. In doing so it was required to move forward in a manner which I believed to be the right one. Taking all things into account of duties required in each of our positions and what changes I felt needed to be implemented, I requested a few of the officers and elected brethren to change many things. Not all Brethren felt I was doing the right thing and made personal decisions on how they elected to proceed. And for this I completely respect their right and thank them for not making a big issue but rather let me try what I felt was proper.

I feel we made great strides in our efforts. Yet I know it is not fixed by any means. But, by getting back to the basics and reading the requirements of the positions. Taking it upon ourselves to do what is asked of us to the best of our abilities and evaluating internally how it can be done better, to strengthen the Lodge (and each other) as to how we progress into the future. By following the steps for which those after us should be able to follow with pride and confidence knowing it is a proper and productively prudent manner in doing so. We can strengthen our Lodge as one which could potentially be mentioned as the example of which others wish to emulate.

As I went through the Grand Lodge records of Sandoval Lodge and seeing how many Brethren were in the rears on their Dues or suspended or quit (Why would they let such a great thing go?), what are we doing to keep them from wanting to return? I feel we are not providing enough Masonry Charitable opportunities for them to work and feel satisfied. We get tied up in the business and meetings and not enough of the efforts of involvement from EVERYONE. Lets work on that with Worshipful Master Tyler and support every event from fellowship to charity... BE THE DIFFERENCE

Looking at the list of candidates whom began their journey but failed to progress was very disheartening. (How have we failed them). Although Covid played a part I believe complacency prevailed. I wanted to concentrate on these men who stalled and reengaging with their coaches and doing their required prophecies and moving on to become Master Masons. And we did just that and raised a few Brothers.

My whole masonic journey thus far, I have tried to make it a personal concerted effort to take on mentorship of incoming candidates. (and I have done quite a few in that time) This is something I am proud to do.

I ask each and every one of you to step up and take the opportunity to coach and mentor. It is something that takes a bit of your personal time but in reality it is very rewarding to watch the progression. It seems candidates start to lag and before we know it, they are into it a year already and still not ready to progress. Help them to get through it quickly and efficiently without taking too long to "Do it perfect". We want them to have the pride being a Master Mason as well as to have the ability to do the work as a Master Mason and not spent all their time memorizing that dang cypher. (There is much more memorization to be had yet).

I decided I wanted to try something I thought to be unique in order to achieve this. I had some beautiful coins designed (thank you WB Tyler and Ali) of which as each brother who progresses to the sublime degree of Master Mason in Sandoval Lodge would receive. On the back of each coin there are areas available in which engraving can be done. (Name, dates for EA, FC, MM). It is my intention that once a brother progresses through all these degrees in Sandoval Lodge and only ONCE THEY DELIVER their Master Mason Proficiency we will engrave their information onto the coin with which they can show off and carry with pride anywhere in the world. (If you have a blank coin and have already given your Sandoval Lodge Master Mason Proficiency on record, please see me to exchange it with a coin that is engraved)

Next was Masonic Education. I did not delve into this as much as I had intended (Much to the chagrin of our newly installed Brother JW Burx...but not for his lack of trying). Masonic Education is vital to learning the history of Masonry and to the morals and ideology of which it might provide. There is so much educational material out there and can become quite a rabbit hole if not careful.

In my humble opinion what is presented to the Blue Lodge itself should be focused on the duties of the Masons who are working in the quarries of the blue lodge, and why those duties are important and how they are essential to the foundations of a strong and healthy Lodge. Education which every member can take from to help the hive as a whole.

It is tough enough keeping up with what's going on in Lodge as an EA and FC (and MM for that matter) without clouding up the water with stuff which gets confusing and difficult to follow

There are many resources for which any brother whom wants to research further into their masonic educational interests have available (See Masonic Lodge of Research members). And for those I feel would be an ideal opportunity if we had a specific evening dedicated to Masonic Education only outside of Blue Lodge specific topics of which those interested can scratch their continued Masonic Educational itch.

When I began my year as Worshipful Waster, I implored you all to get involved. Get Involved with your Community (work the food banks, help those in need), with your Family (spending quality time building a loving and nurturing home), with your Church (Building your relationship with your faith), with the activities within your Lodge (Appendant bodies, setting up activities and participating in what others had set up etc...). This is something not just for my year but for life goals as a whole.

I believe we still have a ways to go in the giving of our efforts toward Lodge and others, but we are doing a great job and making huge strides. With the vision of Sandoval Lodge Worshipful Master Tyler McKenzie and his Officers of 2023 and the many brethren who support and do the work of the craft. We have such an amazing opportunity to let the community as a whole know that Sandoval Lodge is here, willing to help those who will let us. We are a valuable asset waiting to be tapped we just need to make sure they know we are here.

Our continued efforts in programs such as the Sunday is Funday, Bikes for Books, Feeding families through The Ronald McDonald House, Scotch and Cigars Night fundraising, Continual Raffles, perhaps putting up an online store to sell Merchandise like we have in the lodge display and beyond, and any other Fundraising ideas for ideas which you believe the community might be interested in participating. These all provide the funds and notoriety to support the growth and strength of our lodge as well as provide the face to face interactions which are essential for the community to know Sandoval Lodge and our outreach endeavors. Once they know who we are and if they are willing to support us then we can support them with fiscal strength to do the good we know we can.


